



# ACCOUNTING AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

## Itasca Community College - University of Minnesota, Duluth

The Labovitz School of Business and Economics offers degrees in accounting and business administration. The economics major is a Bachelors of Arts degree conferred by the College of Liberal Arts. The economics staff and faculty reside in LSBE. Within the business administration degree, LSBE offers a challenging MBA programs which prepares students; for careers in business, government, and non-profit agencies.

The bachelor of accounting degree (B.A.C.) program is designed to provide students with the analytical foundation of the discipline of accounting which should qualify them for careers as professional accountants in public, industrial, and governmental accounting. The program also provides students with an excellent background for other positions requiring managerial and analytical skills and for graduate or other advanced professional education.

Students following the suggested course schedule below indicate that they are pursuing the Associate in Arts degree at Itasca Community College (ICC) with the intent to transfer to the above named institution. The purpose of this transfer guide is to provide a sequenced curriculum of courses recommended by the receiving institution taken within the Associate in Arts degree at ICC.

\*Note: Courses numbered below 1000 and courses with a “D” grade or lower do NOT transfer.

Students seeking admission to candidacy for the Bachelor of Accounting and for the Bachelor of Business Administration degrees must meet a minimum GPA requirement of 2.50 in all courses and in all University of Minnesota courses, calculated separately, and a 2.00 GPA for all SBE courses (Accounting, Business Administration and Economics or equivalent courses for transfer students). Students will be admitted to candidacy on a competitive basis. Please see the UMD School of Business and Economics website for Degree Requirements.

Courses taken at Itasca, other than those listed, may be used as lower division electives if approved by the department involved. See transfer guide in the ICC Counseling and Career Center, Backes Student Center #107.

Students must complete an upper division (junior-senior) writing course at UMD.

### ***The Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and Itasca’s Associate in Arts Degree***

The public higher education colleges and universities in Minnesota have developed a common liberal education curriculum called the **Minnesota Transfer Curriculum**. Students who complete the Associate in Arts degree at Itasca Community College will have automatically met all Minnesota Transfer Curriculum requirements. **Those students not pursuing an Associate degree at Itasca will not be eligible for state or federal financial aid.**

Completing the Associate of Arts degree at ICC satisfies UMD's liberal education requirement.
