The Criminal Justice B.S. degree requires a minimum of 128 credit hours for graduation. Of these 128 credits, 42 are included in the liberal education requirements and 66 are included in the major core curriculum. This leaves 20 credits that a student may take as general electives. It is **strongly recommended** that a student pursue a minor program (i.e., Psychology, Chemical Dependency, etc.) in a collateral area, decided upon with the help of an advisor.

Completion of the Associate of Arts degree or the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum at Itasca will satisfy Bemidji's general educational requirements.

The Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and Itasca's Associate in Arts Degree

The public higher education colleges and universities in Minnesota have developed a common liberal education curriculum called the **Minnesota Transfer Curriculum**. Students who complete the Associate in Arts degree at Itasca Community College will have automatically met all Minnesota Transfer Curriculum requirements. Students desiring to complete the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum requirements and then transfer without the Associate in Arts degree may pick up a MNTC checksheet in the Counseling and Career Center.
