## Itasca Community College-University of Minnesota Duluth

The mission of the University of Minnesota School of Medicine, Duluth, is to educate students who will practice family medicine and other primary care specialties in rural Minnesota and American Indian communities, to provide high quality academic and clinical education programs for professional, graduate and undergraduate students, and to create distinguished research programs that advance knowledge in the health sciences, including rural and American Indian health issues.

The integrated two-year curriculum at the School of Medicine is a unique blend of basic, clinical and behavioral sciences that carefully prepares students for medical practice. A significant amount of time is devoted to basic science-clinical correlations allowing the students to apply the basic science-clinical correlations allowing the students to apply the basic sciences to clinical medicine. Under the tutelage of family practice preceptors practicing in Duluth as well as small communities in grater Minnesota, students experience an early exposure to patients. This aspect of the curriculum reinforces the students' interest in family medicine and is a central component of the curriculum.

Under arrangements with the University of Minnesota Medical School in Minnesota, all students who successfully complete the two-year program at Duluth are eligible for transfer to the Medical School in Minneapolis to complete their M.D. degree.

Before beginning study at the School of Medicine Duluth, all matriculated applicants must have a baccalaureate degree in a major field of their own choice. The applicant's undergraduate program must include the following minimal distribution of coursework:

Traditionally, the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) takes four years in Medical School following at least a B.A. or B.S. degree. Under special circumstances, a student may be allowed to graduate in less than four years.

Applicants take the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) in May the year prior to the year of entry (the junior year).

### *The Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and Itasca's Associate in Arts Degree*

The public higher education colleges and universities in Minnesota have developed a common liberal education curriculum called the **Minnesota Transfer Curriculum**. Students who complete the Associate in Arts degree at Itasca Community College will have automatically met all Minnesota Transfer Curriculum requirements. **Students not pursuing an Associate degree at Itasca will not be eligible for federal or state financial aid.**
