

## SUMMER 2010 FINANCIAL AID (May 17 – July 9, 2010)



### Options for summer aid (based on your 2009-2010 FAFSA information):

- **Pell Grant**, IF you are eligible and are attending at least 6 credits.
- **Minnesota State Grant**, IF you have eligibility based on the number of summer credits you have and have not exceeded the equivalent of nine semesters of previous college education— check your award notice.
- **Federal Stafford Loan or Minnesota SELF Loan**, IF you are half-time (6 credits or more) and have not borrowed the maximum annual amount during the school year.
- **Workforce Investment Act (WIA) Grant**, IF you have been funded during fall or spring—contact their office at 327-4480 to check on summer funding eligibility.
- **Tribal funding**, IF you were eligible during the school year and funds are still available for summer. Check with your tribal office.

### Procedures:

1. **Register** for summer session beginning April 1. As soon as you register, you will show up on a listing that triggers the Student Services (Financial Aid) Office to write a summer award letter for you.
2. A postcard will be mailed to you letting you know about your eligibility for summer aid. If you need to borrow a student loan, you must be enrolled at least half-time (6 or more credits). You may need to make an appointment with our office after spring semester grades are posted to determine your loan eligibility. Those students who have 30 or more earned credit hours at the end of spring semester (once grades are posted) may have additional loan eligibility available.
3. **Book charging**: Students with enough financial aid to cover tuition/fees and books may charge books from May 11-18 in the ICC Bookstore.
4. Summer aid will be applied to student accounts on Monday, May 25th with aid overage checks available at 9 a.m. on Tuesday, May 26th in the Business Office. Bring your Student ID card!
  - **Aid will be based on the number of credits you have as of 4:30 p.m. on Monday, May 17.**
  - **If you drop a class that has not yet started or if a class is cancelled after May 18th, aid will be adjusted based on your new credit level.**
  - **Summer aid will be cancelled for students not making Satisfactory Academic Progress once spring semester grades have been posted.**
